as a data gatherer, auditor, and trainer, distilling each of the assessment methods into lists helps me see things more clearly.

The resulting finite list of choices helps me focus on the interconnectedness of things while identifying methods and artifacts to support audit and due diligence activities.

This helps identify methods and artifacts that support more than one assessment procedure.

This would help to quickly identify

overlapping responsibilities and data sources, shared responsibilities for gathering data, help determine primary and secondary information sources and support personnel

help service providers and their customers clearly define shared responsibilities.

My process was to take each column and remove duplicate statements.
